NOTIFICATION

No.HD 282 POSIAA 2008, Bangalore, Dated : 28th May, 2009

Whereas the draft of the Karnataka State Police including Ministerial Services (Recruitment) (Amendment) Rules, 2009 was published as required by sub-section (2) of section 3 of the Karnataka State Civil Services Act, 1978 (Karnataka Act-14 of 1990) in Notification No.HD 282 POSIAA 2008 dated 9th February, 2009 in Part IV-A of the Karnataka Gazette (Extra Ordinary) dated 10th February, 2009 inviting objections/suggestions from persons likely to be affected thereby within 15 days from the date of the publication in the Official Gazette.

Whereas the said Gazette was made available to the public on 10-02-2009.

And whereas objections and suggestions received within the period specified above have been considered.

Now, therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of Section-3 read with Section 8 of the Karnataka State Civil Services Act, 1978 (Karnataka Act-14 of 1990), the Government of Karnataka hereby makes the following rules namely :-

RULES

1. Title and commencement.- (1) These rules may be called the Karnataka State Police including Ministerial Services (Recruitment) (Amendment) Rules, 2009.

(2) They shall come into force from the date of their publication in the Official Gazette.

2. Amendment of Schedule.- In the Schedule to the Karnataka State Police including Ministerial Services (Recruitment) Rules, 2004,-

(a) in the entries relating to the category of posts of Sub-Inspector of Police (Civil) at serial number 10, for the entries in columns No (5) and (6), the following shall be substituted, namely:-

However, ex-servicemen who have previously availed benefit of ex-servicemen reservation for any Government service shall not be eligible to avail the benefit again under these rules.</p> <p>(b) Qualification</p> <p>Must be holder of a degree from a recognised university or possess an equivalent qualification.</p> <p>(c) Qualification for in-service candidates,-</p> <p>(i) Must be holder of a degree from a recognised university or possess an equivalent qualification.</p> <p>(ii) Must have put in a service of not less than eight years in any of the cadres of Assistant Sub-Inspector of Police / Head Constable / Police Constables in any wing of the Karnataka Police.</p> <p>(iii) Notwithstanding anything contained in Karnataka Civil Services (General Recruitment) Rules, 1977 must not have attained the age of,-</p> <p>(a) 40 years in the case of the candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.</p>

Gazette and also advertise in not less than four leading newspapers having wide circulation out of which atleast one shall be in kannada. It shall also give publicity through All India Radio and Doordarshan in this regard.

The Selection Authority shall on receipt of the applications in response to the notification, prepare a list of eligible candidates and selection shall be made on the basis of the performance in the following tests in chronological order :-

(A) ENDURANCE TEST (ET) :

- (i) 1600 mtrs. run in not more than 7 minutes for Men and 400 mtrs. run in not more than 2 minutes for women, inservice candidates and exservicemen.
- (ii) Long Jump or High Jump :
 Long Jump – not less than 3.80 mtrs. for men and not less than 2.50 mtrs for women, inservice candidates and exservicemen.
 High Jump – not less than 1.20 mtrs for men and not less than 0.90 mtrs. for women, Inservice candidates and exservicemen.
 Candidates may choose either one or both the jumps but they must atleast qualify in either of the Jumps (in maximum 3 chances).
- (iii) Shot Put (7.26 Kgs.) – not less than 5.60 mtrs. for Men,
Shot Put (4 Kgs.) – not less than 3.75 mtrs. for women, inservice candidates and exservicemen (in maximum 3 chances).

Candidates including inservice and ex-servicemen have to qualify in all the above three tests in chronological order to be eligible for the Physical Standard Test.

(B) PHYSICAL STANDARD TEST (PST):

(a) for Men

Height - 168 cms

Chest - 86 cms (fully expanded) with a minimum expansion of 5 cms

Provided that in case of non-availability of sufficient number of ex-servicemen

(b) 35 years in the case of other Candidates.

(d) Training

Selected candidates shall undergo training as specified by the DG and IGP from time to time. In the case of direct recruits, they are liable to be discharged and, in the case of in-service candidates, reverted to their original cadre if they do not pass the specified tests.

(e) Probation

Notwithstanding anything contained in Karnataka Civil Services (Probation) Rules, 1977, both directly recruited and in-service candidates shall be on probation for two years and six months including the training period.

(B) For Promotion:-

Must have put in a service of not less than eight years in the cadre of Assistant Sub-Inspector (Civil):

Provided that if officials who have put in not less than eight years of service are not available, officials who have put in a service of not less than five years may be considered for promotion.

candidates of prescribed height only then ex-servicemen candidates with lesser height may be considered during final selection.

(b) for Women

Height - 157 cms

Weight - 45 kgs.

The Endurance Test and Physical Standard Test shall be conducted by a committee consisting of an Inspector General of Police / Deputy Inspector General of Police, (Chairman) and two officers of the rank of Superintendents of Police (Members) to be nominated by the DG and IGP.

Any attempt by a candidate to appear in more than one centre for Endurance Test and Physical Standard Test shall be a disqualification.

The candidates who qualify in the Endurance Test and Physical Standard Test shall be called for a Written Examination.

(C) WRITTEN EXAMINATION (WE) :

There shall be a written examination in English or Kannada consisting of two papers namely,-

(a) Paper - I : Shall consist of two parts. First part consists of Essay writing of not more than 600 words in English or Kannada carrying 20 marks and Precis writing in Kannada carrying 10 marks. The second part consists of translation (1) from English to Kannada and (2) from Kannada to English carrying 20 marks. Paper-I shall be of one hour and thirty minutes duration carrying 50 marks. (30 marks for Essay and Precis and 20 marks for translation). There shall be no minimum marks.

(b) Paper - II : Shall consist of questions on General studies comprising of General knowledge, Current Affairs, Science, Geography, History, Indian Constitution, National Freedom movement, General Mental ability and Moral education. It shall carry 150 marks and there shall be no minimum marks. It shall be objective type with multiple choices and of one hour and thirty minutes duration. There will be negative marking. Appearance in both the papers is compulsory.

After the written examination, the Selection Authority shall prepare a merit list based on the marks obtained by the candidates in the written examination.

(D) VIVA-VOCE (VV): Based on the merit list prepared on the basis of marks obtained in the Written examination, the candidates shall be required to appear for an interview carrying 10 marks in the ratio of 1:2 for each post in each category and group as the case may be. There shall be no minimum marks. However, appearance in the viva-voce is a must. Non appearance in viva-voce will be a disqualification.

On the basis of the marks secured in the written examination and viva-voce and after taking into consideration the reservation of posts provided by any law, rule or order, a Provisional Select List in the order of merit of candidates equal to the number of vacancies notified shall be prepared and published by the Selection Authority.

(E) MEDICAL EXAMINATION (ME) :

After the publication of the Provisional Select List, the candidates included in the provisional select list shall have to appear for a comprehensive medical examination before a Medical Board at the time and place decided by the Selection Authority.

The Medical Examination shall consist of the following :

(a) Vision

Must have the following standard of distant and near vision with or without glasses.

Each eye must have full field vision. Colour blindness, squint or any morbid

condition of the eyes or lids or of either eye shall be a disqualification.

(b) Hearing:

- 1) Rinne`s Test
- 2) Weber`s Test
- 3) Tests for Vertigo

Any defect observed during the tests mentioned above shall be a disqualification.

(c) Varicose veins shall be a disqualification

(d) Impediment in speech shall be a disqualification

(e) Chest X-Ray shall be taken for examination.

All the above tests shall be conducted by the Medical Board. Only such of the candidate who shall be certified as physically fit in the medical examination shall be considered for appointment.

(F) APPOINTMENT :

The Selection Authority, after medical examination by the Medical Board, prepare second Provisional Select List on the basis of result of the medical examination and send such list to the Appointing Authority, to satisfy itself on such enquiry as may be considered necessary that the candidates are otherwise found suitable in all respect for appointment. On receipt of enquiry report from the Appointing Authority, the Selection Authority shall prepare a Final Select List of such candidates. Such Final List shall be published in the Official Gazette. The candidates whose names are included in the Final Select List may be appointed by the Appointing Authority against the vacancies in the order in which their names appear in the Final Select List.

(b) in the entries relating to the category of posts of Police Constable (Civil), (Men and Women) at serial number 14, for the entries in columns No (5) and (6), the following shall be substituted, namely:-

(iii) In respect of Commissionerates other than Bangalore, the Selection Authority shall consist of :-

Conduct of recruitment, processing of application and evaluation of common written examination shall be done by the DIGP, Training and Recruitment as Coordinator Police Constable recruitment.

After getting prior approval of the Director General and Inspector General of Police for the number of vacancies to be filled, the Selection Authority of the District concerned, shall invite applications from eligible candidates in such forms as may be specified by the Selection Authority by giving wide publicity by publishing the Notification in the Official Gazette and also advertise in not less than four leading Newspapers having wide circulation out of which atleast one shall be in kannada. It shall also give publicity through All India Radio and Doordarshan in this regard.

The Selection Authority shall on receipt of the applications in response to the notification, prepare a list of eligible candidates and selection shall be made on the basis of the performance in the following

tests in chronological order :-

(A) ENDURANCE TEST (ET) :

(i) 1600 mtrs. run in not more than 6 minutes 30 seconds for Men and 400 mtrs. run in not more than 2 minutes for Women & Ex-servicemen.

(ii) Long Jump or High Jump :

Long Jump – not less than 3.80 mtrs. for men and not less than 2.50 mtrs. for Women & Ex-servicemen.

High Jump – not less than 1.20 mtrs for men and not less than 0.90 mtrs. for Women & Ex-servicemen.

Candidates may choose either one or both the jumps but they must atleast qualify in either of the Jumps (in maximum 3 chances).

(iii) Shot Put (7.26 Kgs.) – not less than 5.60 mtrs. for Men,

Shot Put (4 Kgs.) – not less than 3.75 mtrs. for Women & Ex-servicemen. (in maximum 3 chances).

Candidates including Ex-servicemen have to qualify in all the above three tests in chronological order to be eligible for the Physical Standard Test.

The Endurance Test and Physical Standard Test for each district other than the commissionerates shall be conducted by the Chairman (SP of the District / SP, Railways) and two members (DySPs nominated by DG and IGP) as stated at para II (i) (1) and (2) above. In case of Commissionerates by the concerned Chairman and Police members as stated at Para-II (ii) and (iii) (1), (2) and (5)

above.

The candidates who qualify in the Endurance Test and Physical Standard Test shall be called for a Written Examination.

(C) WRITTEN EXAMINATION (WE) :

There shall be a common written examination on the same date and time for all the Districts/ Commissionerates either in Kannada or English carrying 100 Marks. The questions shall be of Objective type with multiple choices. It shall consist of questions on General Studies comprising General Knowledge, Science, Geography, History, Indian Constitution, National Freedom Movement, General Mental Ability and Moral education. It shall be of one hour and thirty minutes duration. There will be negative marking.

The Selection Authority shall prepare a merit list by adding the percentage of marks obtained by the candidates in the qualifying examination and in the written examination conducted by the Selection Authority. After taking into consideration the reservation of posts provided by any law, rule or order a Provisional Select List in the order of merit of candidates equal to the number of vacancies notified in each category and group shall be prepared and published.

(D) MEDICAL EXAMINATION (ME) :

After the publication of the Provisional Select List, the candidates included in the provisional select list shall have to appear for a comprehensive medical examination before a Medical Board at the time and place decided by the Selection Authority.

There shall be a written examination either in Kannada or English carrying 100 Marks. The questions shall be of Objective type with multiple choice. It shall consist of questions on General Studies comprising General Knowledge, Science, Geography, History, Indian Constitution, National Freedom Movement, General Mental Ability and Moral education. It shall be objective type with multiple choices and of one hour and thirty minutes duration. There will be negative marking.

The Selection Authority shall prepare a merit list by adding the percentage of marks obtained by the candidates in the qualifying examination and in the written examination conducted by the Selection Authority. After taking into consideration the reservation of posts provided by any law, rule or order a Provisional Select List in the order of merit of candidates equal to the number of vacancies notified in each category and group shall be prepared and published.

(D) MEDICAL EXAMINATION (ME) :

After the publication of the Provisional Select List, the candidates included in the provisional select list shall have to appear for a comprehensive medical examination before a Medical Board at the time and place decided by the Selection Authority.

The Medical Examination shall consist of the following :

(a) Vision :

Each eye must have full field vision. Colour blindness, squint or any morbid condition of the eyes or lids or of either eye shall be a disqualification.

(b) Hearing:

- 1) Rinne`s Test
- 2) Weber`s Test
- 3) Tests for Vertigo

Any defect observed during the tests mentioned above shall be a disqualification.

(c) Varicose veins shall be a disqualification

(d) Impediment in speech shall be a disqualification

(e) Chest X-Ray shall be taken for examination.

All the above tests shall be conducted by the Medical Board. Only such of the candidate who shall be certified as physically fit in the medical examination shall be considered for appointment.

(E) APPOINTMENT :

The Selection Authority, after medical examination by the Medical Board, prepare second Provisional Select List on the basis of result of the medical examination and satisfy itself on such enquiry as may be considered necessary that the candidates are otherwise found suitable in all respect for appointment. The Selection Authority shall then prepare a Final Select List of such candidates. Such Final Lists shall be published in the Official Gazette. The candidates whose names are included in the Final Select List may be appointed by the Appointing Authority against the vacancies in the order in which their names appear in the Final Select List.

(j) in the entries relating to the category of posts of Police Sub-Inspector, State Intelligence at serial number 68, for the entries in columns No (5) and (6), the following shall be substituted, namely:-

It shall also give publicity through All India Radio and Doordarshan in this regard.

The Selection Authority shall on receipt of the applications in response to the notification, prepare a list of eligible candidates and selection shall be made on the basis of the performance in the following tests in chronological order :-

(A) ENDURANCE TEST (ET) :

- (i) 1600 mtrs. run in not more than 7 minutes for Men and not more than 400 mtrs. run in 2 minutes for women, inservice candidates and exservicemen.
- (ii) Long Jump or High Jump :
 Long Jump – not less than 3.80 mtrs. for men and not less than 2.50 mtrs for women, inservice candidates and exservicemen.
 High Jump – not less than 1.20 mtrs for men and not less than 0.90 mtrs. for women, inservice candidates and exservicemen.
 Candidates may choose either one or both the jumps but they must atleast qualify in either of the Jumps (in maximum 3 chances).
- (iii) Shot Put (7.26 Kgs.) – not less than 5.60 mtrs. for Men,
Shot Put (4 Kgs.) – not less than 3.75 mtrs. for women, inservice candidates and exservicemen (in maximum 3 chances).

Candidates including inservice and ex-servicemen have to qualify in all the above three tests in chronological order to be eligible for the Physical Standard Test.

(B) PHYSICAL STANDARD TEST (PST):

(a) for Men

Height - 168 cms

Chest - 86 cms (fully expanded) with a minimum expansion of 5 cms

(a) 40 years in the case of the candidates belonging to the Scheduled Castes, the Scheduled Tribes and Other Backward Classes.

(b) 35 years in the case of other Candidates.

(d) Training

Selected candidates shall undergo training as specified by the DG and IGP from time to time. In the case of direct recruits, they are liable to be discharged and, in the case of in-service candidates, reverted to their original cadre if they do not pass the specified tests.

(e) Probation

Notwithstanding anything contained in Karnataka Civil Services (Probation) Rules, 1977, both directly recruited and in-service candidates shall be on probation for two years and six months including the training period.

Provided that in case of non-availability of sufficient number of ex-servicemen candidates of prescribed height only then ex-servicemen candidates with lesser height may be considered during final selection.

(b) for Women

Height - 157 cms

Weight - 45 kgs.

The Endurance Test and Physical Standard Test shall be conducted by a committee consisting of an Inspector General of Police / Deputy Inspector General of Police, (Chairman) and two officers of the rank of Superintendents of Police (Members) to be nominated by the DG and IGP.

Any attempt by a candidate to appear in more than one centre for Endurance Test and Physical Standard Test shall be a disqualification.

The candidates who qualify in the Endurance Test and Physical Standard Test shall be called for a Written Examination.

(C) WRITTEN EXAMINATION (WE) :

There shall be a written examination in English or Kannada consisting of two papers namely,-

(a) Paper - I : Shall consist of two parts. First part consists of Essay writing of not more than 600 words in English or Kannada carrying 20 marks and Precis writing in Kannada carrying 10 marks. The second part consists of translation (1) from English to Kannada and (2) from Kannada to English carrying 20 marks. Paper-I shall be of one hour and thirty minutes duration carrying 50 marks. (30 marks for Essay and Precis and 20 marks for translation). There shall be no minimum marks.

(b) Paper - II : Shall consist of questions on General studies comprising of General knowledge, Current Affairs, Science, Geography, History, Indian Constitution, National Freedom movement, General Mental ability and Moral education. It shall carry 150 marks and there shall be no minimum marks. It shall be objective type with multiple choices and of one hour and thirty minutes duration. There will be negative

marking. Appearance in both the papers is compulsory.

After the written examination, the Selection Authority shall prepare a merit list based on the marks obtained by the candidates in the written examination.

(D) VIVA-VOCE (VV): Based on the merit list prepared on the basis of marks obtained in the Written examination, the candidates shall be required to appear for an interview carrying 10 marks in the ratio of 1:2 for each post in each category and group as the case may be. There shall be no minimum marks. However, appearance in the viva-voce is a must. Non appearance in viva-voce will be a disqualification.

On the basis of the marks secured in the written examination and viva-voce and after taking into consideration the reservation of posts provided by any law, rule or order, a Provisional Select List in the order of merit of candidates equal to the number of vacancies notified shall be prepared and published by the Selection Authority.

(E) MEDICAL EXAMINATION (ME) :

After the publication of the Provisional Select List, the candidates included in the provisional select list shall have to appear for a comprehensive medical examination before a Medical Board at the time and place decided by the Selection Authority.

All the above tests shall be conducted by the Medical Board. Only such of the candidate who shall be certified as physically fit in the medical examination shall be considered for appointment.

(F) APPOINTMENT :

The Selection Authority, after medical examination by the Medical Board, prepare second Provisional Select List on the basis of result of the medical examination and send such list to the Appointing Authority, to satisfy itself on such enquiry as may be considered necessary that the candidates are otherwise found suitable in all respect for appointment. On receipt of enquiry report from the Appointing Authority, the Selection Authority shall prepare a Final Select List of such candidates. Such Final List shall be published in the Official Gazette. The candidates whose names are included in the Final Select List may be appointed by the Appointing Authority against the vacancies in the order in which their names appear in the Final Select List.
